

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

REGISTRATION - Students can confirm their attendance and collect their registration bag at the front administration desk. Registration for each age category opens 30 minutes prior to the category start time.

SHEET MUSIC - Providing a copy of your sheet music is not mandatory, but is highly recommended where possible.

TUNING/PRACTICE - Multiple practice rooms will be available to students for tuning instruments, warming up or practicing prior to their event.

PERFORMANCES - Students and the name of their piece will be introduced by the event host (students do not need to introduce themselves).

COMING/GOING - Students and families are welcome to enter and exit a session at any time. Please note that an entry/exit opportunity is made available between performances to minimise competitor disruption.

PRESENTATIONS - Presentations will take place on stage at the end of each section (approximately 10 minutes after the final performance).

INSTRUMENTS/GEAR

DRUM KIT - Students will perform on the competition 5 piece acoustic kit.

CYMBALS - The following cymbals will be provided for students: 2x crash (16", 18") 1x splash, 1x china, 1x ride and 1x hi-hat.

PEDALS - A double kick pedal will be available for students to use in their performance. Students are permitted to bring their own pedal if preferred.

STICKS - Students are required to bring their own drumsticks. Spares will be provided on the kit.

BACKING TRACKS - Backing tracks are permitted and must be submitted no later than September 13th (see next page for instructions on submitting your backing track).

HEADPHONES - Over-ear monitor headphones will be provided for students to use in their performance.

ADJUSTMENTS - Students are permitted to re-arrange the kit where needed. If you perform with a left-handed setup, please let us know in advance by emailing admin@osic.com.au.

WHAT TO PERFORM

Students can perform any piece within a

4 minute time limit. Full pieces, cut pieces, sections of a piece, and sections of multiple pieces are all accepted.

ACCOMPANIMENT/ BACKING TRACKS

BACKINGTRACKS - Backing tracks are permitted and must be submitted no later than September 13th.

HEADPHONES - Over-ear monitor headphones will be provided for students to use in their performance.

SUBMITTING A BACKING TRACK - To submit your backing track, follow the steps on the OSIC homepage, or visit: www.osic.com.au/uploadbacking

EXPLICIT LANGUAGE - Use of clean/censored backing tracks is encouraged where explicit language is present.

LIVE ACCOMPANIMENT - Live accompaniment is permitted, but must be noted under 'stage requirements' during registration, or via email (admin@osic.com.au).

ASSESSMENT

Students will be assessed on the following criteria:

Timing and Rhythm

Consistency (no rushing or dragging)
Groove (strong & natural feel)

Dynamics

Volume control (balanced changes)

Technique

Precision (accuracy & execution)
Posture (stability & placement)
Difficulty (complexity of piece)

Creativity

Originality (personal interpretation)
Musicality (connection to music)

Stage Presence

Confidence (assurance & poise)
Energy (engagement & enthusiasm)

AUDIENCE TICKETS

Remaining tickets will be available for purchase on the event day at the OSIC registration desk.

Please note that limited seats are available for audience in each age category. Some age categories are already close to capacity and may sell out prior to the event. There is no guarantee of availability to purchase audience tickets on the competition day.

An audience ticket is a reserved seat to the listed age category. Tickets also permit entry into all other categories on the same day (subject to available seats).

Competing students do not need an audience ticket, and can attend all other categories on their event day (subject to available seats).

All drums finals will take place at Vision Studios (East Victoria Park).

LOCATION - Access is via the main entrance, located on the Milford Street service road (Milford Park).
