

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

REGISTRATION - Students can confirm their attendance and collect their registration bag at the front administration desk. Registration for each age category opens 30 minutes prior to the category start time.

SHEET MUSIC - Providing a copy of your sheet music is not mandatory, but is highly recommended where possible.

PRACTICE - Multiple practice rooms will be available to students for warming up prior to their event.

PERFORMANCES - Students and the name of their piece will be introduced by the event host (students do not need to introduce themselves).

COMING/GOING - Students and families are welcome to enter and exit a session at any time. Please note that an entry/exit opportunity is made available between performances to minimise competitor disruption.

PRESENTATIONS - Presentations will take place on stage at the end of each section (approximately 10 minutes after the final performance).

INSTRUMENTS/GEAR

PIANO - Students will perform their piece on the competition grand piano.

STOOL-Students are permitted to adjust the piano stool height before beginning their performance.

PEDAL EXTENTDER - A pedal extender will be provided for students where required.

LIGHTING - Sheet music lighting will be provided.

WHAT TO PERFORM

Students can perform any piece within a 4 minute time limit.

Full pieces, cut pieces, sections of a piece, and sections of multiple pieces are all accepted.

ASSESSMENT

Students will be assessed on the following criteria:

Timing and Rhythm

Consistency (no rushing or dragging)
Flow (strong & natural feel)

Dynamics

Volume control (balanced changes)

Technique

Precision (accuracy & execution)
Posture (placement and alignment)
Difficulty (complexity of piece)

Creativity

Originality (personal interpretation)
Musicality (connection to music)

Stage Presence

Confidence (assurance & poise)
Energy (engagement & enthusiasm)

Competing students do not need an audience ticket, and can attend all other categories on their event day (subject to available seats).


VENUE DE
